Open Call

Heinrich Böll Foundation, represented through its offices in Ramallah, Beirut, Tunis, and Rabat in cooperation with the International Union for Conservation of Nature / Regional Office for West Asia (IUCN ROWA), will be hosting a regional Autumn School "Natural Resource Rights in the Arab Middle East and North Africa" in Amman, Jordan from November 23 – 27, 2014.

Objectives:

- To increase the capacity and skills of members and employees of NGOs or other civil society organizations, activists, young professionals, postgraduates, and researchers;
- To promote networking among civil society activists and researchers in the region;
- To provide a platform for exchanging ideas, opinions, arguments, and sharing experiences;
- To strengthen policy-oriented research and activism in the fields of resource rights, governance, climate, gender and environment geared towards sustainable solutions.

Who can apply?

Members and employees of NGOs/CSOs, young professionals, postgraduates, activists, and researchers.

Required qualifications of the participants:

- > To be active in the field of resource rights, governance, climate, gender and environment;
- At least two years of work, research, or environmental activism experience in the field of resource rights, governance, climate, gender and environment;
- Good command of written and spoken English language;
- President of Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia, Libya or Algeria;
- > Age between 23 and 35.

Application procedure:

Interested persons are required to submit:

- Application form (available at www.ps.boell.org, www.lb.boell.org, www.tn.boell.org, and ma.boell.org);
- > Updated Curriculum Vitae;
- A short paper focusing on the topic of the Autumn School and show the applicant's knowledge as well as his/her ability to work independently and creatively. To this end, the applicant should choose a topic from within the subject area and point out its relevance to their local or national context, e.g. by introducing an exemplary project, a current debate etc. This can be written in form of an essay or a short research paper (not more than 2 pages).

Travel and accommodation costs of the participants will be covered by the Heinrich Böll Foundation.

Working languages of the summer school will be Arabic and English with translation.
